


# High Path regeneration update

## Phase one update

The first new homes at High Path phase one will be ready in June. The rest will be handed back for High Path residents to move into, by the end of the year.

The first residents will be moving into Rodney Place. The homes include new fitted kitchens, bathrooms, white goods and outdoor space.

We want to ensure the move into your new homes is as smooth as possible so we have arranged for a removal company to help you with your move. We will give you plenty of notice to allow time to get ready and pack.

#### **Bulk waste service**



## School's out online learning initiative

In January we started an online learning initiative with Merton Abbey Primary School and Hill, the building contractor on High Path.

The aim was to support pupils who might fall behind in their school work during lockdown.

Throughout the 15-week programme everyone was encouraged to complete online learning at home. Those who regularly logged in and completed their work to a high standard received a gift pack and were entered into a weekly prize draw for a chance to win one of ten \$10 WHSmith gift vouchers.

It was a great success with the children and their parents.

Michael Bradley, Headteacher at Merton Abbey Primary School said: "The vouchers have really got the children excited – we've been announcing the voucher winners each week. It's definitely got more of the children submitting work regularly – and some parents even mentioned the vouchers very positively in feedback during our recent survey. It's been a lovely initiative."

## On the job training

Charlotte is a **Site Manager** apprentice at Hill working on High Path, part of the Merton regeneration project. She was offered the apprentice role through the Clarion Futures team after completing a two-week placement with Hill's site management team.

She carries out quality inspections on the High Path project and works with the production team on the construction site.

Charlotte said: "I came into this apprenticeship with no knowledge about construction and I am learning something new every day. My confidence is growing daily. I'd say to anyone considering an apprenticeship 'go for it', it's a great way of learning while earning."

Practical skills are backed up with qualifications and Charlotte is working towards her NVQ Level 3 and plans to become a fully qualified site manager.

So far eleven apprentices have been employed at High Path. Future phases of regeneration will create many more employment and training opportunities for local residents and young people.
